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#### Foreword:

This booklet gives an inside look into one of Young Modern Magazine, 1965 Australia music industry's cornerstones: The (Courtesy of Mortlock Collection, State annual Battle of the Bands. Even though Library of South Australia, Adelaide) Hoadleys sponsored the competition for seven years; battles of bands have continued in Australian Discography 1960-1989, different forms since the early 1970s and existed prior to Hoadley's involvement.
